A beloved teacher and colleague, Antonio Cua died on March 27, 2007. Having joined the faculty of the School of Philosophy in 1969, he retired, in 1996, at the rank of professor emeritus. His writings in moral philosophy, Chinese philosophy, and comparative ethics earned him a world-wide reputation. He was active in many learned societies, and honored with many awards. His books include *Reason and Virtue: A Study in the Ethics of Richard Price* (1966, revised 1998), *Dimensions of Moral Creativity: Paradigms, Principles, and Ideals* (1979), *Unity of Knowledge and Action: A Study in Wang Yang-Min's Moral Psychology* (1982), *Ethical Argumentation: A Study in Hsun Tzu's Moral Epistemology* (1985), *Moral Vision and Tradition: Essays in Chinese Ethics* (1998), and *Human Nature, Ritual, and History: Studies In Xunzi and Chinese Philosophy* (2005). He was also editor in chief of the landmark *Encyclopedia of Chinese Philosophy* (2003).
